About OUMS

Oxford University Music Society has been at the heart of the music scene in Oxford since its foundation in 1872, making OUMS one of the university's oldest student-run organisations - but we pride ourselves on moving with the times.





We are the umbrella organisation for nine ensembles:

three orchestras, two wind ensembles, a jazz band, a string group, a brass band, and a university-wide chorus. In these pages you will find out more about each of these groups, along with our current list of Affiliated Ensembles (bringing together a world-renowned chamber choir, an award-winning a cappella group, and a legendary funk band - among many others) and information about music-making in Colleges.

OUMS has a dedicated online publication, OPUS, and we're always keen to hear from potential writers and concert reviewers (who get a free ticket for their efforts!). If you'd like to get involved with community music, we have an enthusiastic Access and Outreach team for you to get in touch with. We also have a dedicated committee to match up players and provide support for chamber music, and there are opportunities across OUMS for concerto playing, conducting, and composing. If you have any questions not answered in this booklet, you can visit our website (www.oums.co.uk), or get in touch with the relevant committee member.

Becoming a member of OUMS is entirely free, and allows you to access all the opportunities and socials we offer. We are also introducing an additional tier of membership, OUMS+, which is a great way to show your support for the society in return for some fun benefits. Joining OUMS+ costs £25, which lasts for the duration of your time at uni, and gives you discounts on concert tickets and stash among other perks. Joining an OUMS ensemble is simple. To sign up to any of our four non-auditioned groups (OUSE, OUSB, OUBB, and OUChorus), simply fill in the form to become a member of OUMS (see the opposite page!) and, on the next page, select the ensemble(s) you would like to join. The other ensembles are auditioned, but you only have to do the one audition to be considered for any of them (apart from OUJO who run their own, much jazzier, auditions).

If you're looking to play in **OUO**, **OUSinf**, **OUPhil**, **OUWO**, or **OUJO**, you'll need to fill in the audition form, by scanning the QR code below, or visiting our website (<u>www.oums.co.uk/auditions</u>).

Responses are due by Friday 6th October at 4pm, and auditions will be held at the Faculty of Music on Saturday 7th & Sunday 8th October. Our website will be kept up to date with audition info, including when each instrument's slot is, so do keep checking back there for updates.

We hope our auditions will be as relaxed, friendly, and painless as possible, so if you have any questions before the big day, please get in touch in any way you'd like.

We hold a brief but intense rehearsal period for a week which culminates in a concert on Friday of 6th Week. As the premier chamber orchestra of the University, OUSinf provides opportunity for players to perform famous works at a very high standard, while also remaining dedicated to showcasing underplayed and contemporary repertoire, with recent concerts including works by Kurt Weill, Emilie Mayer, and Anna Clyne. We host a student composition competition each year, with the premiere of the winning piece given in Hilary Term.

Every Michaelmas we also run a Concerto Competition, with the winner performing in our Hilary concert. We regularly perform large-scale symphonic works, with recent concerts featuring Holst's 'The Planets', Stravinsky's 'Firebird', Elgar's Cello Concerto, and Price's 'The Oak'. This term we are delighted to be collaborating with OUChorus for a performance of Mahler's 'Symphony No. 2: Resurrection Symphony' at the Sheldonian Theatre.

Christ Church Cathedral St Aldate's

Christ Church is home to the Cathedral Choir and is also a useful ensemble rehearsal space because of its proximity to the Music Faculty.





Newman Rooms Rose Place & St Aldates

Large rehearsal space used by bigger OUMS ensembles like OUO. Sometimes called the Catholic Chaplaincy.





Cohen Quadrangle Walton Street

Another frequently used rehearsal space, particularly by OUPhil. It's an annex of Exeter College.



Wesley Memorial Church New Hall Inn St

A rehearsal space next to St Peter's College. Often shortened to the 'Wes Mem'.






